Recent events both at the railway and other areas in my life have given me cause for some reflection. The members of CMR are a diverse bunch of people, coming together from many and varied walks of life and backgrounds, a range of age groups and professions. Yet still we all come together to enjoy our common hobby, of running a miniature railway, as and when we are able to according to other demands on our time. This also of course means that there are many and varied opinions on how, when and why different things should be done, indeed it is these ideas that often promotes spirited discussion round the clubroom table. © The challenge for the committee and, the club as a whole, is to take these ideas and develop them into workable options that will take the club in the right direction to ensure we're here for another 50 years. Sometimes we come up short and need to re-assess the options, other times we land on our feet and keep running, either way as a club, ultimately, we are all responsible for the future direction and development of the railway and its surroundings.

A couple of general comments on housekeeping, before I get to some highlights for this month,

- Loco Owners, can you please ensure that an occasional sweep out and tidy up of your shed bay is carried out. We do have visitors through the loco sheds on occasion and we need to ensure that the area is safe, for both them and your fellow members, 5 minutes is all it takes for a quick tidy up of your area.
- In the workshop, if tools are being used, please remember to put them back where they belong. Members all come to the railway at differing times for various reasons, and the equipment is there for all to use.
- Members using the Metal cutting Drop Saw, please, unless weather is inclement, use this piece of
 equipment outside on the beam near the containers. This makes the workshop far more user friendly
 for the rest of us who are there at the time, and is generally easier to use.

And now for some good news.

The old Ballast bin has now been cut up for scrap, this being the case a scrap steel bin will be on the agenda in the very near future. This will also mean that the material and track stockpiles adjacent to the workshop are in for a spring clean and major tidy up. This MAY be organized for the workday on September 8th, but this will be advised at the next General Meeting prior to the September Running day.

There has also been some chatter of late about re-establishing the club's library facilities, long since forgotten. To go towards this, we have recently been the recipient of a large donation of books and magazines on railways, and mechanical engineering subjects from a deceased estate, as well as similar contributions from the collections of Bob Moss, and Ernie Nelson (both deceased). It will be possible to amass a relatively large collection for members' access in fairly short order, but as always the question is who will look after it and maintain it. Should anyone be interested in the position, please make yourself known to me, and we can get the ball rolling. To make room for this, it is envisaged that the work wagon may be relocated out of the breezeway into the steam shed, and the breezeway track removed. There is a lot to think about before this happens though:

- Lawn seeding of the picnic area seems to be working. The fenced off area has been rearranged and another section seeded.
- The old swing set has been removed from the Picnic Area
- The first stage of fencing work around the picnic area has been upgraded with additional posts, new mesh and strainer wires
- Recent batch of sleepers has been cut
- Maroon set of wagons has gone for painting, hopefully by the time this is being read, they will have returned and be getting fitted out for a return to traffic. Keep an eye out for a new colour scheme on this set. ☺
- We received some time ago a quantity of steel for new rail, it is envisaged that this will be rolled for use on the September workday.

The club has for sale one garden mulcher. The machine has had little use since being purchased, as we are able to obtain mulch in bulk quite readily, and is therefore in very good condition. If any members are interested, it can be seen at the railway, in the compressor room. It is for sale by tender, with bids to the secretary.

For those of you with too much time on your hands, remember, there are usually people on site working on all manner of projects each Wednesday, most Saturday mornings, and some Friday afternoons. If you're not sure what's on for any given day, just yell, and we'll be glad to see you there.

My bit has been a bit longwinded this month, so I'll wrap up with one last item and leave you all in peace 'til October.

Many of you will recall last year we held a run from Wilson to support research into Juvenile Diabetes. I am pleased to say this will be run again on the 3rd Sunday in September, from Wilson Park Station, if you're able to lend a hand on the day, it will be appreciated.



Building Progress Report.

A few photos to show some of the work Judy & I (plus lots of help from others) have done.









These engines were designed and built in the Midland Workshops in the 1930's, a total of 10 were manufactured. This engine is being built 4.74 times smaller than original. The drawings we are working on are dated 1928 and the main assembly drawings have lots of detail and are 1.6 m wide. When complete the engine will be about 12 feet long.












The boiler will be a steel locomotive style boiler and will have a round top above the fire box. The belpaire shape will be a dummy.

Notes from the last Committee Meeting – these are only a brief summary of some of the items discussed.

- Reminder that General members meetings now to be held quarterly the next being September 2012
- Maroon set of carriages is currently at Thornlie TAFE for repainting should be back at the club in the near future
- Work on Dependable is an ongoing project the electrical side has been completed work on the body is progressing with a thorough clean up and then the loco will be re-assembled and then put into test
- 50th Anniversary celebration flyer sent to all AALS clubs planning is progressing. Logo has been selected for the event.
- Sub committee formed to work through matters raised by SRT during recent on site visit further meeting held with SRT staff and all matters progressing satisfactorily at this stage. As a result of these meetings, members are reminded that the site we occupy is under the primary control of both the SRT and the Dept of Environment & Conservation and accordingly there are protocols in place that must be adhered to when working around the grounds. It is important that members do not disturb earthworks without prior consultation with either your President or Secretary. These matters are still ongoing with the Secretary now in discussions with the W A Planning Commission.
- Roster forms for both Duty Officer & Canteen staff for the next few months have been sent thank you to those members who have responded to the call.
- Work in the picnic ground is continuing more slabs have been put in, mulch put in place, and most of
 the fence has been repaired. There is still more to be achieved here and the work is progressing
 slowly, however it is subject to the approvals process.
- Committee in the process of planning meetings re the future direction of the club and its infrastructure,
- Quote for construction of new signal box obtained further quotes to be sought prior to proceeding with this project.

 material to be included gratefully received and will be acknowledged. My thanks to those members
