The President's Bit

To kick off this month, I'd like to thank all those who turned out (some for three days straight) to run both the railway, and the stand at the model railway exhibition over the recent June long weekend. The results were fantastic. I appreciate the work that goes into this weekend by all concerned, however in a bid to try and improve things, next year we will try something a bit more formal and roster these running days in conjunction with staffing requirements for the show. It is hoped that by going down this path we can ease some of the workload on the members involved and at the very least, have a plan of attack with which to face the weekend. However, for this to work it needs the commitment of the membership at an early stage. Please bear this in mind when the roster forms are sent out in the months leading up to next year's run.

The last few running days we have seen a few instances arise of some concern. It must be remembered that on these days, while we are members of a club enjoying our hobby, we are dealing with the general public, and therefore need to both portray a professional attitude, and run the railway in an organized manner.

On run days one member is in control of the day's operations. As the Duty Officer, this person has the final say, and should an incident arise they should be the first point of contact – either directly, or via radio and "Control".

Since our last edition, it has been great to see things progress around the railway. The station canopy repaint has been completed, with some new signage being organized and it will be refitted as soon as available. Some of you will also have noticed that the turntable handrails have been removed, these are currently offsite being sandblasted prior to being restored to their original colour of white. It is envisaged the turntable deck may also be returned to its original colour.

The breezeway door has been replaced, and the steel / timber wall panels either side of it replaced with brick and outside handrails reconfigured. Elsewhere, in the Diesel Shed, further work has been done to continue the clean out, with the loco bays in the process of being painted, some wall cracks repaired, as well as various other small jobs before the whole room itself is repainted. In the steam shed, some new oil drip trays have been obtained. If these prove to be satisfactory, more will be obtained over time.

Unfortunately, with all this good news, we have suffered some bad. Within a week of hearing that we had, after 8 months, finally received the building permit for the new signal box, we were then informed that the builder contracted to do the job had gone into voluntary administration. Unfortunately, this poses us with a number of problems. As I write this piece, we are uncertain of the company's future. Mike is working on a number of avenues to try and progress this project.


- As mentioned in the last issue, there are a number of C.I wheel sets in the workshop, which have been deemed to be surplus to requirements. Should anyone be interested in obtaining some / all of them, please contact myself. They are available for the cost of a small donation to the club. I would envisage that more might become available in the future as we progressively overhaul bogies and wheel sets.
- As a part of our new Swan River Trust Permit, a "Project Management Plan" has to be submitted before we carry
 out major works around the site. This is being worked on now, and will be submitted as soon as practicable.

With various things happening away from the railway, my attendance has unfortunately been a bit more sporadic then I would like. Hopefully this will change shortly with things easing off. Looking forward to "getting back to work" and back to a couple of stalled projects.

Again, my thanks to those who have taken up on a couple of the small projects listed in the last couple of issues. The remainder of the list is reprinted in this issue, so please give it some thought, if you're not currently engaged in anything or have spare time on your hands that you're willing to provide, pick a job, come and see (or call, or e-mail) myself and I will arrange the necessary consumables required. There's nothing overly taxing if tackled the right way, but all will go towards the betterment of our facilities.

Till next month, this week promises some more workshop time and hopefully some progress.


Club facilities clean up

As mentioned elsewhere this issue, the following is a small list of projects which need attention in the coming few months. It's pleasing to see a few items have been taken up as projects by members. While they don't all need to be done by the time that the club's 50th comes around, it seems logical to use this date as a goal by which to achieve a major spruce up of our facilities. Many of these items can be done solo or by a group, so if you think there's something you think you can take on, as mentioned I'd love to hear from you.

In no particular order of priority:

- Painting of Bailey Bridge (tied in with a project to re-deck the bridge later in the year)
- · Repaint Steam shed exterior wall
- Lay 2 additional sidings alongside carriage shed
- Establish a long term solution for water supplies to Canning steaming bays and station area
- Repaint and Prepare flagpole for re-location
- Continue Ballast work for line and level improvements, and expansion joint replacements.

President's Report - Cinders & Soot - 10th Anniversary Edition - November 1973

About this time we can say Castledare has been 'going' for 10 years, or should I say 'going on' for 10 years. When we look back and see what happened [and a lot of it did just happen – through hard work] an unending list of events begins to come out. In that 10 years we have had many members and past members, give their time and efforts for the creation of what is commonly known as "Castledare" for short – Castledare Miniature Railway.

Much work has been forgotten – we are apt to forget, so we can get on – as though it has always been so. In the last 12 months – do you realise 12 months ago the "Southern Railway" was not in commission and the auto telephone exchange had just begun to be used?

During the last year many items have 'appeared.' The completion of the south loop track. The new carriage shed – flashing lights and bells at south crossing – new locos have appeared. The 3½" gauge track is well on its way to being re established and a station building at Avon well under way.

WAGR type [obsolete] bell code signaling between Avon and Niana [Central] have been 'installed'. And of course the many unseen works like new points to be installed at Avon, drainage, and 'flood control' [the south tunnel had 6" of water at the end of winter]. And most recently the draining and re-bedding of the cutting. It has been a most rewarding year of progress.

The thanks of the Club goes to all who made this creation possible in the last 10 years for those to come in the years hence.

My personal thanks to all in helping with this creation, of which I like many others, feel justly proud in saying "I helped build Castledare"

FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK

Notes from the last Committee Meeting – these are only a brief summary of some of the items discussed.

- Safety Management System being put together a work in progress at this stage.
- Niana Station has been painted
- Work has commenced on the breezeway/clubroom upgrade. The first part of this has been the relocation of the work wagon to the diesel shed [following a re-arrangement of the loco storage area] and the removal of the work wagon track. The breezeway entry door to the yard has been rebuilt and walls either side have now been bricked in.
- Painting of Bayou Bridge is in hand.
- SRT approvals [subject to some conditions] for the plan submitted last July have now been
 received. Secretary attended meeting with both SRT Management & Manager of Christian Bros.
 resulting in a more definitive map showing SRT and other boundaries in relation to CMR
 infrastructure and an awareness of what information is required by SRT from CMR in relation to
 gaining approval permits for various projects.
- Work progressing on foreshore management document required by the SRT
- Advertising is now appearing in the Parent Paper free newspaper available in most shopping centres, etc.
- Soak drains have been installed at the front and rear of the workshop

At a committee meeting held Sunday 16th June to discuss the current issues with the supply and installation of the new Niana A signal cabin, Mike Crean offered his services, which have been accepted, as the Project Manager and will liaise with the parties involved.

As you may be aware, a contract was entered into for the new signal box, plans were drawn and submitted for approvals through the relevant authorities. Unfortunately in the time taken for approvals to be received, the company contracted for this project was placed into Voluntary Administration.


The Secretary has been working through various aspects of this difficult situation and Mike will follow this through to, hopefully, a successful conclusion for the club.

ANNUAL AMRA MODEL RAILWAY EXHIBITION:


