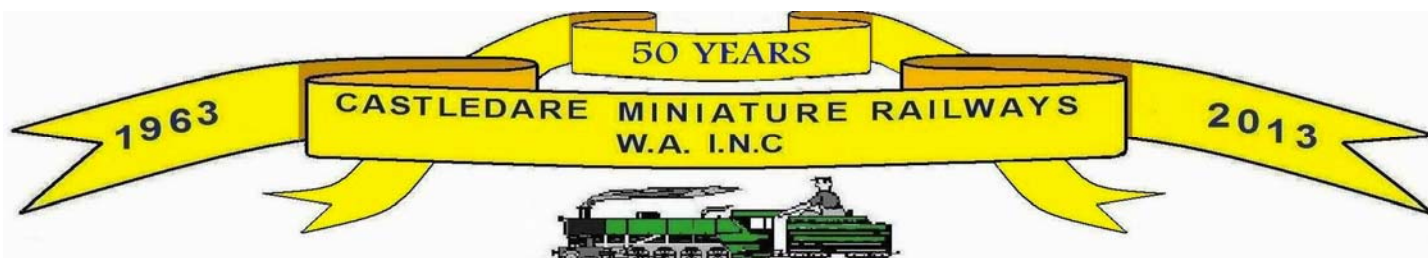

The President's Bit

To begin with in this issue, I would again like to say thank you to everyone who contributed to the preparation for and running of our 50th Anniversary event. The work that went into the event and the railway as a whole was most gratifying and very pleasing to see. As a result we have had several membership requests, mostly from past members considering rejoining the fold.

The crew working on "A Cabin" have continued, I noticed yesterday that the fascia boards have been fitted and internal cabinets installed.

Leading up to the 50th, the track crew continued work on the expansion joints with more being replaced through the wetlands, this work now sees expansion joints replaced or rebuilt from the dual bridge throughout the mainlines in the Wetlands, back as far as the Little Stone Bridge. This will be all we can do out there for this year, as conditions are now too dry to attempt further replacements. A section of track has also been replaced on the mainline behind "A Box" in deference to the ties that had severely corroded. This section is slated for replacement, likely in the first couple of months in 2014. Fire train and coal wagon storage sidings have both also been refurbished.

As indicated a couple of issues back, approvals for the carriage shed extension and wagon storage bunker were expected imminently. I am pleased to say these have been received and work has commenced on both jobs. At the time of writing, the footing has been poured for the brickwork to the extension, with brickwork proper around ¾ complete. Simultaneously, work has continued on preparing the sand pad for the box culverts to be installed for the additional storage bunker. Further ground works are required here before we organize a crane to come in and lift the cast bases for the boxes into position in readiness for the next step.

The club Christmas party is coming up. This will be held as in recent years, at the club, with more details to follow separately.

Till next month, hopefully we all get some more time in the workshop... ☺

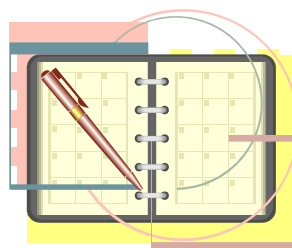

WORK DAYS:

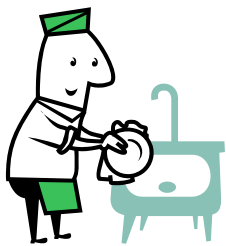

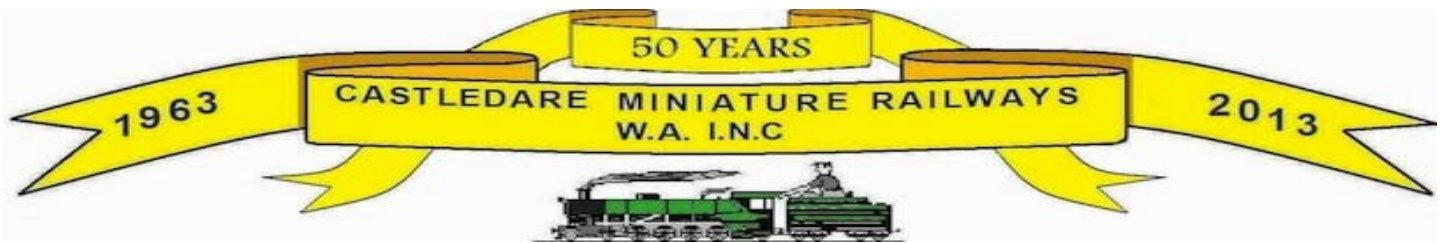
Over 11, 12 and 13 October there was a three-day celebration, during which members and friends, new and old, came together to celebrate what is one of Western Australia's great institutions. I acknowledge the team there, led currently by the president, Craig Belcher, who has been ably supported over many years of course by Ken and Sue Belcher and all the other members of the extended committee of enthusiasts who run CMR. Keith Watson, one of the founders of CMR 50 years ago was on hand to join in the celebrations. It was he, operating out of his place then in Applecross, who first started to nurture the development of 7¼ gauge miniature rail, joined later on by the well-known Jack Stanbridge, and so a great institution was born.

On Sunday, I had the pleasure of being there with the extended "family", for want of a better word. John Ahem proudly showed me around the premises; it was not the first time, but it is always great to catch up on the latest there in terms of locomotives and other developments. Tom Winterbourn was there, and it was nice to catch up with all sorts of friends, old and new. Trish and Richard Stuart were there, as were a whole host of other people, Sunday was a great day, as we celebrated a dream born on the banks of the Canning River as part of the old Castledare Boys' Home, as it then was, and the adventures that Keith and others had in approaching Brother O'Shaughnessy to get a bit of land on which to locate a miniature railway. He reportedly said, "No, no, we don't be needing any railways here", but when it was pointed out there might be some money to be made to help pay for the upkeep of the place, he said, "when can you start"? So the story goes, anyway!

The bottom line with CMR is that it was, has been, and will continue to be well into the future a great institution in Western Australia; one that has brought pleasure, enjoyment and fellowship to so many Western Australians young and old, whether they are down there every Sunday, whether they go there even more frequently to volunteer, or whether they are just an occasional visitor. 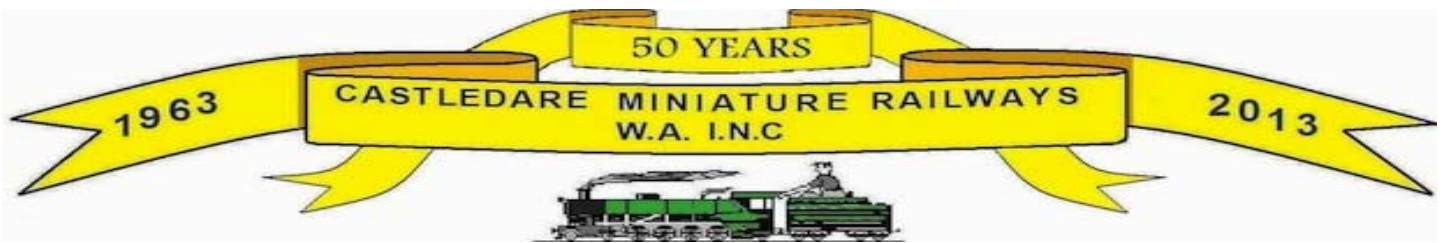
