The President's Bit

First up this month, I'd like to offer my congratulations to Northern Districts Model Engineering Society on the Celebration of their 30th anniversary this month, a milestone for any organization, as we well know. Onwards to your 50th now!

It's been an eventful week at the railway, with yet another car ending up in the river along the wetlands route, near Bullfrog loop. At least this time the offender is known and is being dealt with, and has offered to assist in restitution should it be required. The entry point has been found and the City of Canning notified to enable the problem to be stopped in future. The vehicle has been removed, with minimal impact, but some work was required on the track and the embankment to return them to operating condition.

The Feb 1st Sunday Run was a good steady day, with operations having settled down somewhat over the previous run. Some track work had been carried out over the previous month, with expansion joints being addressed on the Fern Road section (thanks John and Vic) and some sleepers replaced on the Dual Bridge during the first hour of the running day (Eno, Rod, John, much appreciated). We also saw a couple of members passed out with new qualifications which is great to see, congratulations to Luke Mills on his Guard's ticket, and I believe Damelsa Belcher is in line for a signals ticket.

The astute will have noticed that the 6 month calendar, included in the last issue, did NOT include the June long weekend special run. While this run should be taking place, with the current pending changes to local governments, we will confirm this one a bit closer to the time.

Now, for the usual highlights and news...

- The site cleanup in the canning area is now all but complete, with the last of the brick rubble being removed earlier this week. Plans should now move ahead for the contractors to start work on site. Out of interest, some 9 ½ tonne of scrap steel was taken away, along with a 3m brick waste bin, and at least one extra bin lift from Cleanaway. The result is a much tidier area, but there is still a lot to do. The material that has been kept will need to be sorted and stored properly in time to finish the job off.
- As a result of the heavy leaf and bark debris that falls this time of year, the last committee meeting resolved to investigate a contractor to assist with this work, particularly in relation to the picnic area, nothing concrete as yet, but members will be kept updated on what happens here as info is available.
- Signals crew have all but finished Niana North work, with the semaphores back in operation last run day, (was great to see Mike) thanks to all those involved in this project. I believe focus will start shifting towards Niana South (B box) with conversion to air operated points, and eventually the removal of the signal box, all control being centralized in the new cabin. Some track work will be associated with this project in the longer term, seeing the station throat and yard trackage altered for improved flexibility.
- Committee have agreed to engage our building contractor to complete the reconstruction of the footbridge. This work will take place following the March 1st Sunday Run, and will include replacement of the main span deck and rebuilding of the oval side ramp. This project has been talked about for some time now and it is good to see it coming to a conclusion. The next major project in terms of buildings etc, will be the upgrade to the toilet block, as mentioned in previous issues. Quite possible utilizing the same contractor.
- We are in the process of applying for a renewed maintenance permit with the Swan River Trust, this will again be a 2 year permit, though hopefully with a bit more clarity than we have had in the past.

- Rolling stock inspections are underway, with several sets already being attended to and some works carried out to rectify defects found, thanks to Les and Richard for the time being put in to this work.
- Some track work is to be carried out in the yard and planning is underway to see 4 road installed at Wilson Station for storage, to ease congestion on busier runs.

Some discussion has been taking place over the issue of storage of equipment at the railway. While not an immediate issue, (we have a little room to move for the time being) there are a number of locomotives nearing completion that will be looking for space. It is inevitable that at some point soon we will likely reach saturation point and need to strongly consider what options we have to ease the situation. While there is some equipment in the roundhouse that does not see much use, in general terms, we will need to consider what can be done to free up some additional space.

While I know there may be some members attending the Convention in Adelaide at Easter this year, for the rest of us, would there be any interest in a Barbeque (BYO) and night run over the long weekend?? I'd suggest the Friday night, considering we also have a Public Run on the Sunday, but open to suggestions, also open to the possibility of other clubs joining in.

Mention has been made in the last couple of issues of outlining some plans for the future potential of the railway - as I see it. All members on the email list for the club will have (or should have) received a copy, and we should see some hard copies on the clubroom table this weekend all going well. Please do not hesitate to comment, constructively, between the efforts of the combined membership I see a great future for the railway and would dearly like to see it realized.

Till next month, enjoy some workshop time (I know Don has!) and enjoy the railway we have built.

All members should be aware that the club accumulates waste of all types. Batteries and similar waste should be placed beside the rubbish bins in the breezeway for appropriate disposal.

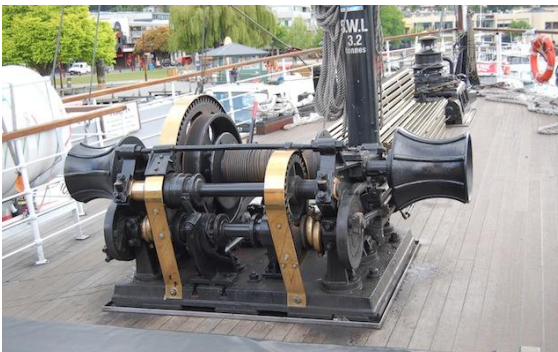
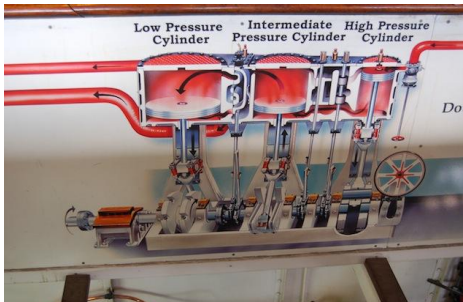
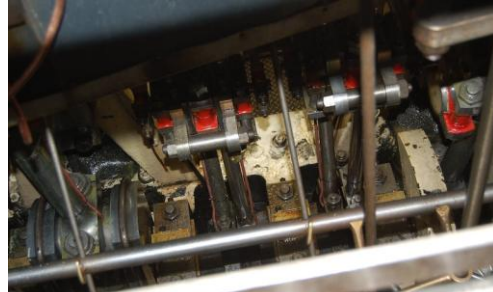
Dual bridge:
